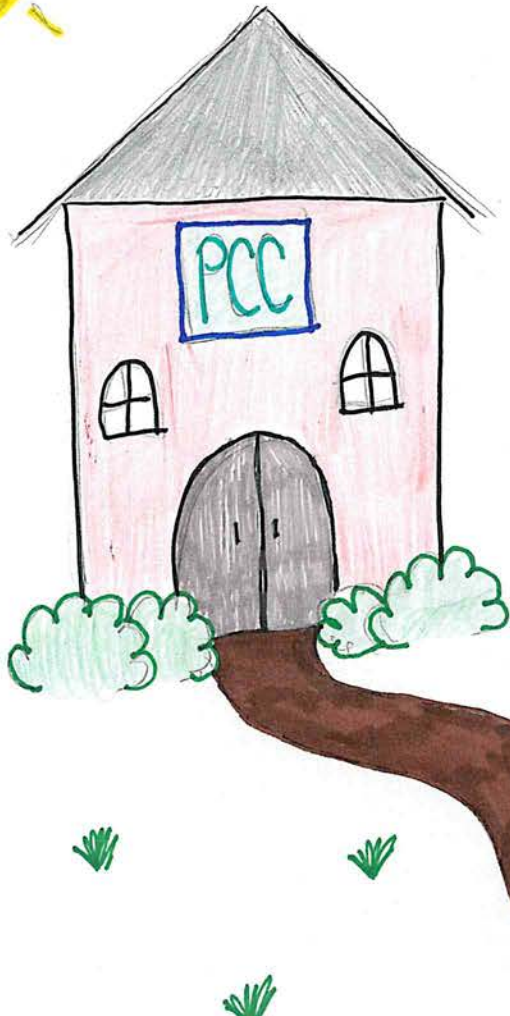
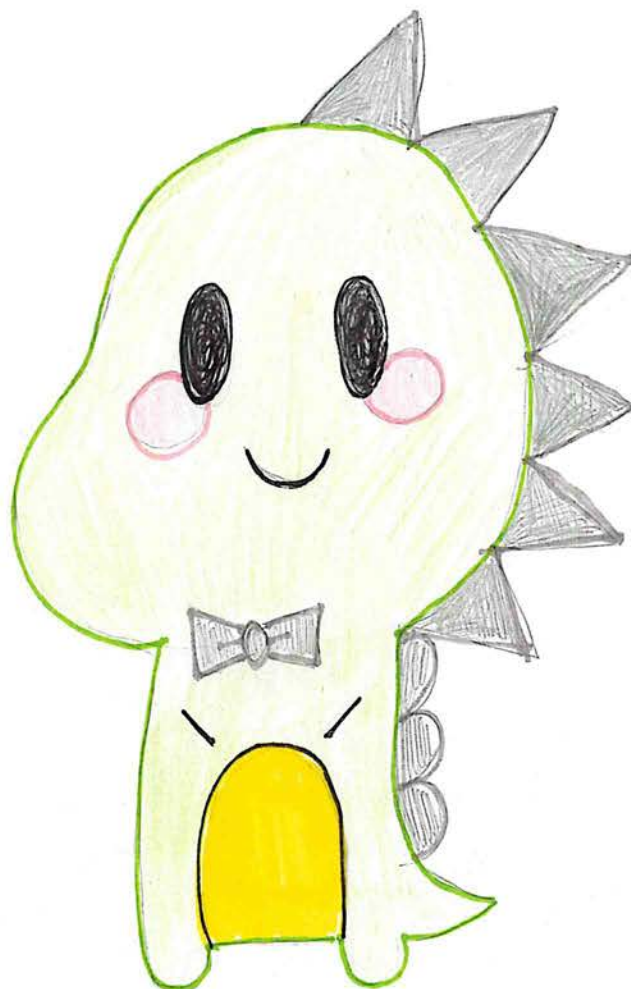
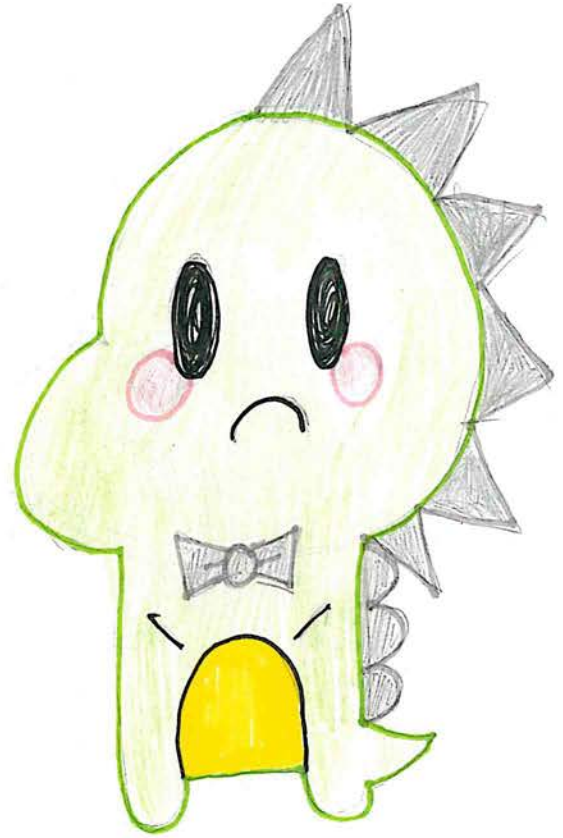
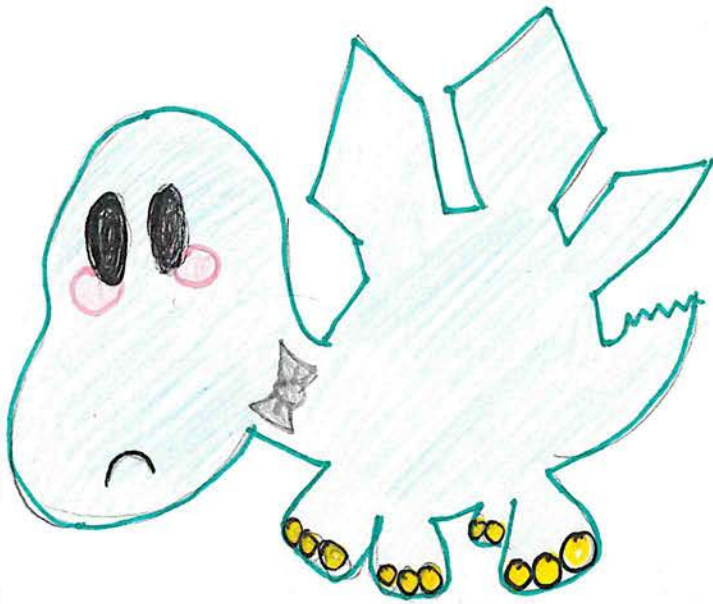


# Baby Dino Goes Back to Daycare





This is Baby Dino. Baby Dino used to go to daycare, or what some people call school, every day while Mommy Dino and Daddy Dino were busy.

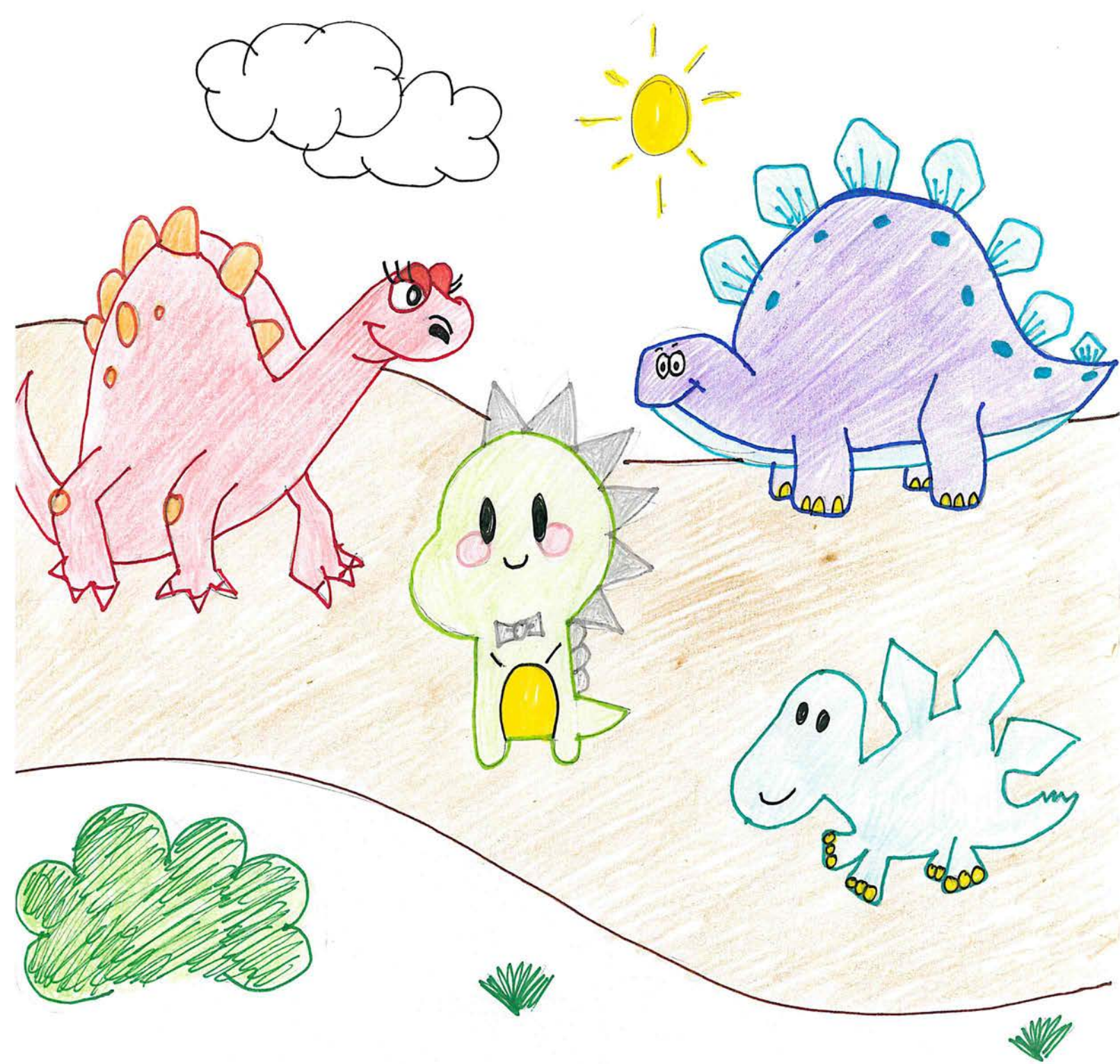

Some of Baby Dino's friends were there, but not all of them. Baby Dino wanted to go hug his friends, but his teacher reminded him that touching isn't good for the virus.

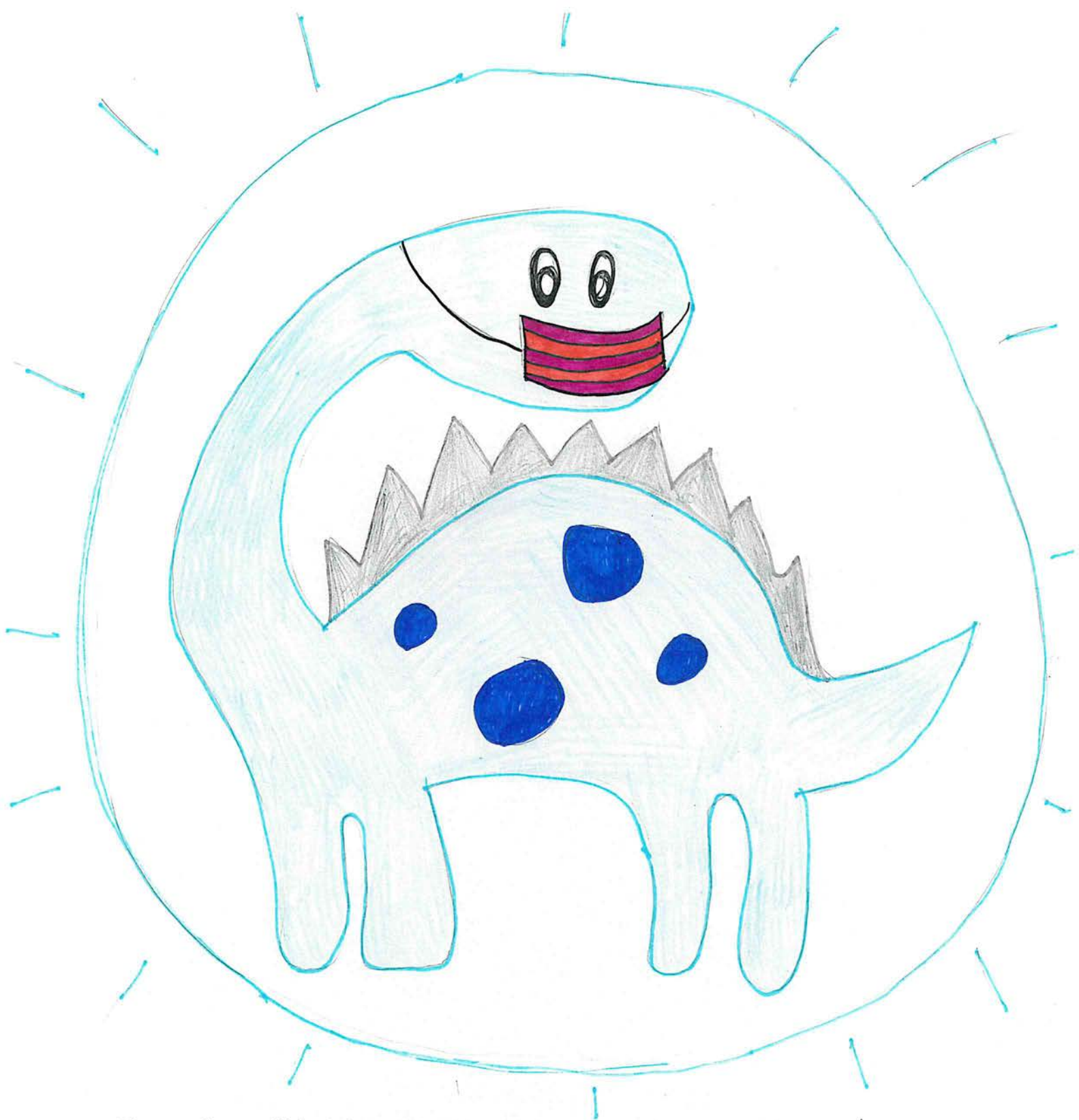
